

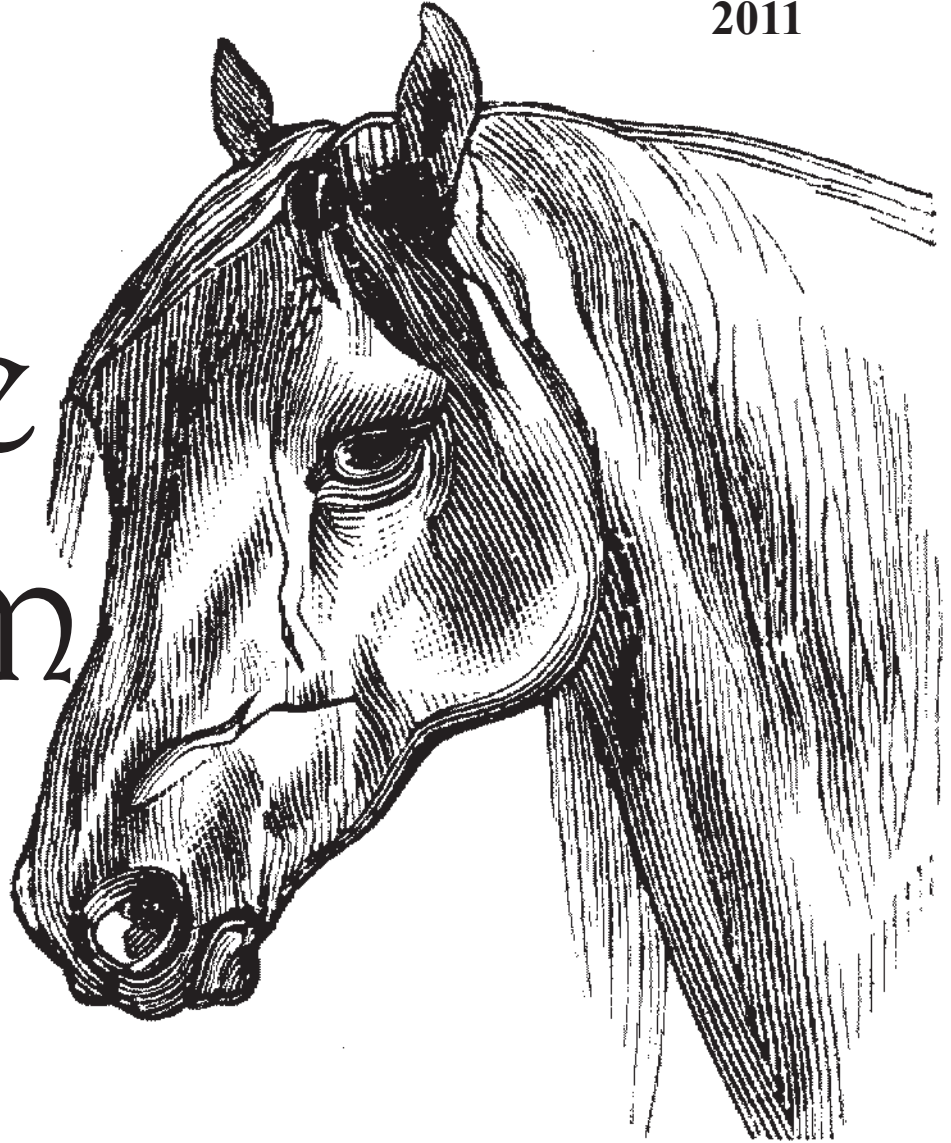

## Horse Program Reminders

The program will follow the rules outlined in the Livingston County 4-H Horse Program Policy Guide Book (county rule book).

All 4-H horse shows will follow the rules outlined in the NYS 4-H Equine Show Rule Book.

Horse Certificates, Rabies, and Coggins paperwork are due in the 4-H Office by May 16th for any horse you may consider using at any county, regional, or state event. **New for 2011 - This also includes all shows in the game show series.** Please consider having an extra horse on file in case something happens to your primary horse.

Acknowledgement of Risk Forms and riding/driving evaluations (if applicable) **MUST** be on file with the 4-H Office before the member's first show.

10 qualifying non-mounted educational points, as specifically outlined in the county rule book, will be required to qualify to ride in a mounted event at the state level but NOT at the county level. The approved list of qualifying events with points is:

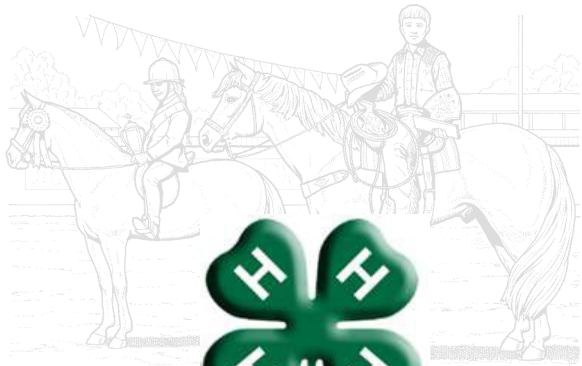
**Important Animal Health Requirement

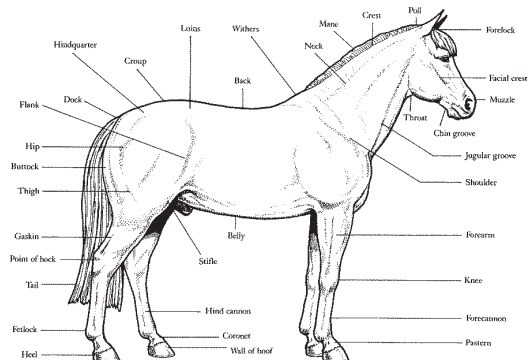

## Horse Camp Parent Meeting Wednesday, June 8th, 7 pm at the Hemlock Fairgrounds

Have you signed your son or daughter up for horse camp? If so, we would like to meet you at our parent information meeting. A parent/guardian of each camper is expected to attend this meeting. It will include a tour of the fairgrounds - which will show you where your child will eat, sleep, the barns we will use, the infirmary, command central, etc. We also use this as an opportunity to train our parent volunteers in the procedure for first aid, how emergencies are handled, and answer all questions you may have about the upcoming camp experience. Finally, the last item on the agenda is to sign up for volunteer responsibilities throughout the week of camp. This year we will have lessons running from 8:00 a.m. through 6:15 p.m.; giving every child a great opportunity to have excellent instruction and a ton of fun in the process! Our camp cannot run without the help of every family; we have 177 volunteer roles/spots. Volunteers can be any adult able and willing to help out during the week. If each family could contribute a few hours of their time it would be a great help to the entire camp program! We need: craft helpers, help delivering snacks, someone to sit in the dorm area, and even at night to chaperone karaoke! We need 2 additional overnight chaperones on several nights and one must be a male. Please let us know ASAP if you are willing to chaperone! If your child is young and needs additional help to tack up, why not sign up for helping in their lesson. If you want to know what they are eating while away from home, come and have dinner with us as the dinner chaperone! 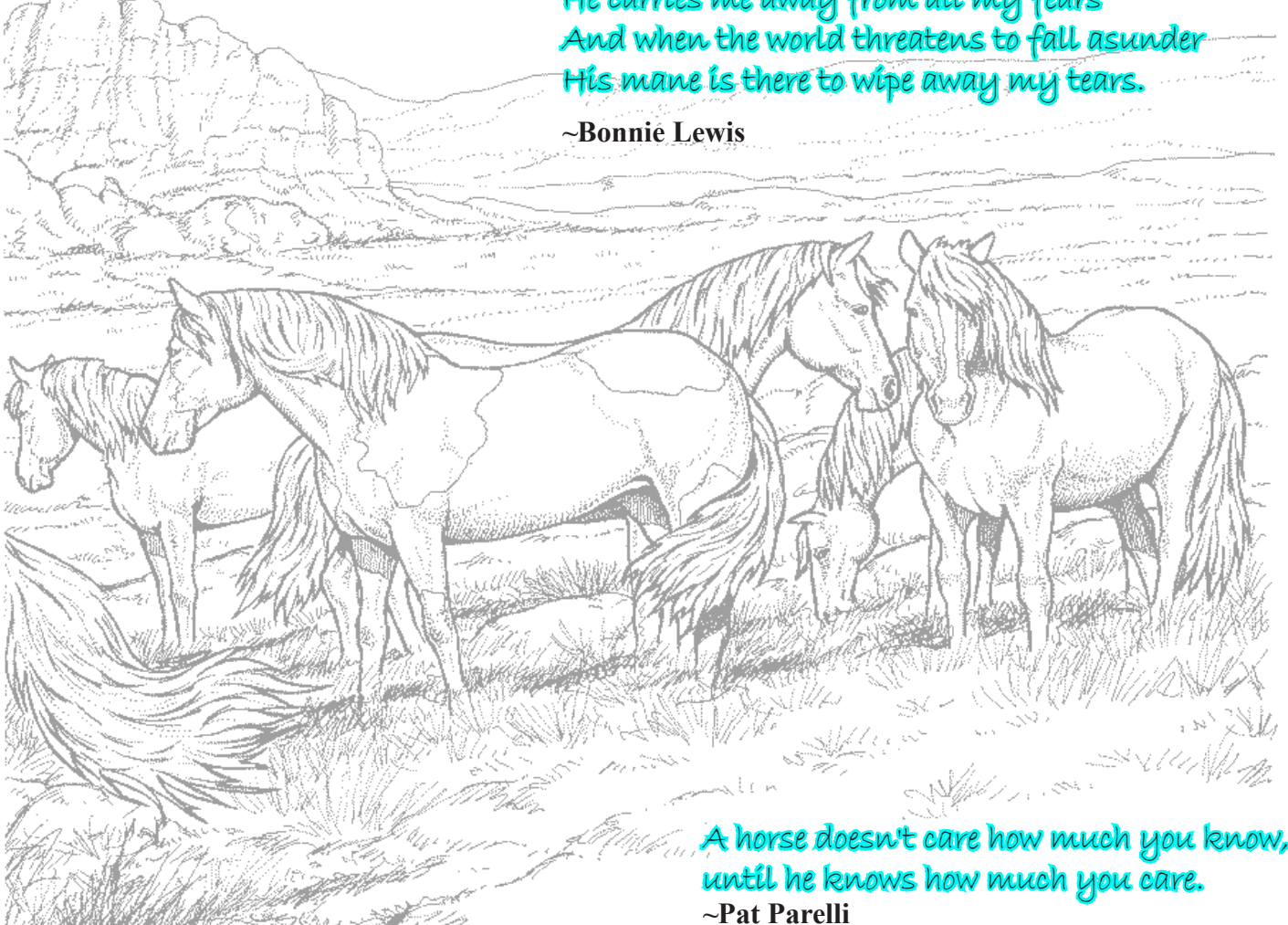

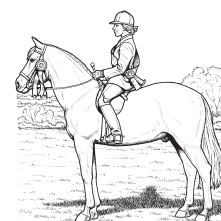

## Driving & Riding Safety Evaluation Information

**All members who are driving will need to have a safety evaluation completed.**

Riders who are moving to a new division which requires a change in skill will need to be evaluated. It is not necessary to re-evaluate members moving from Cloverbud Walk/Trot to regular Walk/Trot. Please contact your club leader, as evaluations will be done at the club level. Individual members may contact the 4-H office for possible evaluation opportunities. Evaluation forms need to be turned into the 4-H Office prior to your first show of the season.

*Evaluation information and forms are available on the Horse Program page of our website*

**The following members will require an evaluation:**

- New Cloverbud riders who have never been evaluated
- Any child who is a first time rider/driver in the county program.
- Cloverbuds who rode in Leadline last year and want to ride in Cloverbud Walk/Trot
- Cloverbuds who will be moving out of Cloverbud and into any division except Walk/Trot. It is not necessary to re-evaluate a member moving from Cloverbud Walk/Trot to regular Walk/Trot.
- Any child who showed in Walk/Trot and wants to cantor or lope.
- ***Cloverbuds are not permitted to drive.***

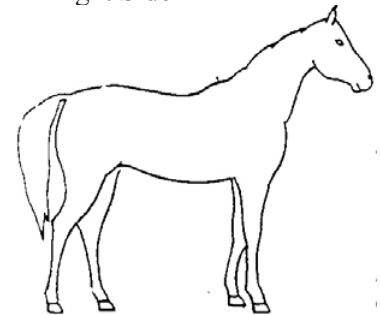
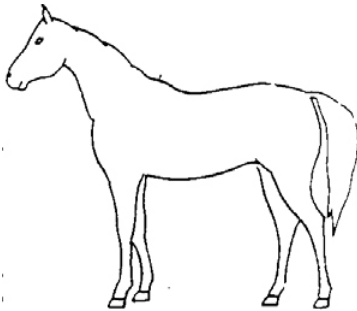

# NEW YORK YOUTH LIVESTOCK NON-OWNERSHIP POLICY

The exhibitor, upon request to the event sponsor, shall provide proof of ownership of any exhibit.

This non-owner certificate verifies that a 4-H member in New York and the owner of the animal have entered an agreement. A lease agreement allows a 4-H member to use the specified animal as a 4-H project.

Cornell Cooperative Extension (CCE) encourages the use of written lease agreements, however, it is the responsibility of the owner and exhibitor to agree upon the lease terms. Neither CCE nor Cornell University is legally involved in writing, implementing, or terminating any lease agreements.

The following bill was legally adopted by the NYS Department of Agriculture & Markets July 1987.

*Exhibits shall have been owned by the exhibitor for a period of at least (30) days prior to the entry of the exhibit provided, however, that any animal exhibit entered in a youth fair, youth exhibition or 4-H show or exhibition shall have been in the care of the exhibitor for a period of at least (60) days prior to entry of the exhibit.*

CCE staff and state program administrators have maintained the following philosophy since 1987.

*Non-owner/lease opportunities are intended for youth who do not already own an animal of this type. For exhibition purposes, youth are limited to one non-owned breeding class animal of this type.*

## Specific for Horse:

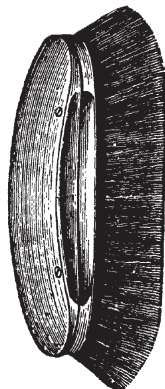
*The only approved NYS Horse Program exceptions are donkey, mule and miniature horses. In which cases a youth may lease a horse and also lease a donkey, mule or miniature horse.*
